

Historical Society

The Ramona Pioneer Historical Society, a non-profit organization, was founded in 1962. More than 400 persons, most of them from Ramona and the surrounding area, are members of the organization. Affiliation is maintained with the San Diego County Congress of History, San Diego Historical Society and the Conference of California Historical Societies. Historical societies are found nationwide and enjoy a reputation as "preservers" of the American heritage. There are many active Historical societies in San Diego County and approximately 200 In California.

The mission of the Ramona Pioneer Historical Society shall be to discover, collect and preserve artifacts, memorabilia, books, pamphlets, maps, genealogies, portraits, surveys, paintings, pictures, relics, manuscripts, letters, journals, field books and any other books, articles, audio visual materials or property which may establish and illustrate the history of the United States, and particularly California, San Diego County and the Ramona area.

Members of our society are afforded free entrance to the museum, receive a quarterly newsletter, the opportunity to attend our periodic potluck dinner meetings, and being able to serve as volunteers at our museum. Our regularly scheduled potluck dinner meetings always have a very informative and entertaining program featuring great guest speakers. Membership fees and donations provide a major portion of the funds necessary to defray the cost of running our society and museum.
